

Self-disclosure on the use of conflict minerals



In January 2021, the EU Conflict Minerals Regulation (EU 2017/821) came into force. The regulation is intended to help restricting trade of the four minerals tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold from conflict and high-risk areas in order to, among other things, prevent the financing of armed conflicts.

As a downstream user, hawa GmbH does not have any binding obligations under EU Regulation 2017/821. We assume that a Union importer procures materials on the basis of the legal regulations or the above EU Regulation.

Conflict minerals are difficult to track within the supply chain. However, we strive to create the necessary transparency in a continuous process within the scope of our possibilities. Suppliers of which it can be reasonably assumed that 3TG minerals could be contained in the articles delivered to hawa GmbH are asked for information on a regular basis. Currently, there are no information available that conflict minerals could be used or contained in our products.
